Details of the injury - is patient awake/conscious, breathing, any serious bleeding or chest pains?

Is an off-road vehicle needed? Is there somewhere the Air Ambulance could land? (see below)



Risk Assessment

Gunton Wood.... Timber Fencing Operations

| Hazard | Risk | Level | Actions |
|----------------------------|---|--------|--|
| Handling treated timber | Sprains, bruises, cuts, splinters. Skin splashed by preservative | Medium | Wear appropriate clothing, including gloves, hard hats. Apply correct lifting procedures. Use wheelbarrow to assist in transportation. Provide First-Aid kit. |
| Using sharp edged tools | Personal injury & Injury to others | Medium | Ensure all participants have suitable training in use of tools. Observe safe working distances, at least twice the length of arm plus tool. No under 14's to use edged tools (except loppers). No gloves to be worn when using swinging tools. |
| Use of post driver | Personal injury | Medium | Ensure operator has adequate strength and uses correct lifting technique. Rotate work to provide rest time for strenuous tasks. Wear safety clothing. |
| Underground services | Contact with cables and pipes | High | Locate and mark existing service lines. Use appropriate safety factors in avoidance. |
| Slips, trips and falls | Personal injury | Medium | Fence line to be kept free of obstructions. Broken skin must be washed and treated immediately. |

General. All workers to be aware of Toxocara canis (from dog faeces), Lyme disease (from ticks), Weil's disease (from rodents), Tetanus inoculation is recommended. Tapes, warning signs and cones to be used to keep public clear of site work.

Gunton Wood.... Shrub, Tree and Vegetation Clearance, Tree Planting

| Hazard | Risk | Level | Actions |
|------------------------------------|------------------------------------|--------|--|
| Standing deadwood Dead branches | Head injury | Medium | Wear hard hats during any operation likely to disturb deadwood or branches. |
| Nettles, brambles | Stings, scratches | High | Wear appropriate clothing. |
| Mud | Slipping – injury | Medium | Use strong footwear that provides a good grip. |
| Dog faeces | Toxocara infection | High | Wear gloves, wash hands (use hand gel) prior to eating, follow good hygiene practice. |
| Using sharp edged tools | Personal injury & Injury to others | High | Ensure all participants have suitable training in use of tools. Observe safe working distances, at least twice the length of arm plus tool. No under 14's to use edged tools (except loppers). No gloves to be worn when using swinging tools. |
| Long handle tools | Injury to others | Medium | Ensure no-one carries tools over their shoulder. |

Risk Assessment

Gunton Wood.... Chainsaw Use

| Hazard | Risk | Level | Actions |
|---|---|--------|---|
| Chainsaw | Cut by saw | High | User to be fully trained in use of chainsaw. Use Personal Protective Equipment. |
| Faulty chainsaw | Injury to user, and others | High | Do pre-start safety checks before using saw, if faulty then label it and remove spark plug. Maintain chainsaw in accordance with manufacturer's handbook. |
| Cut timber in work area | Tripping over | Medium | Remove cut timber from work area frequently. |
| Back injury | Lifting, carrying, pushing, pulling, manoeuvring heavy materials | High | Use correct lifting procedure. Replace manual labour with machinery where possible. Only move materials within the user's capability. Move lightest object to heaviest. Use any aid tools provided (timber tongs, pulp hooks etc.). Pivot loads rather than carry them. Drag roll, move end over end. |
| Fuel / oil spillage | Environmental damage | Medium | A "spill kit" appropriate for the site should be available in case of spilt fuel or oil. Use container with non-spill spout. Replace caps securely. Ensure "O" ring seals are in good condition. |
| Fuel | Overheat in sun and explode | Medium | Store in shady, cool place. Store at least 5metres away from any source of ignition. |
| Public or workers walking into work area | Injury to public or workers | Medium | Warnings on all foreseeable approaches to work area. Use warning signs, cones and tape. Operator to ensure public and workers observe safety zones. |
| Overhead power Lines | Carrying long / tall branches | Medium | Make everyone aware of OHPL, carry branches close to ground. |
| Hazards hidden in long grass/undergrowtl | Tripping over h | Medium | Check for and remove hazards before starting work. |

General: Only fully trained workers to operate chainsaws. Safe working techniques as used in training must be observed. Before starting, have a plan of your intentions. Use appropriate tools and equipment. Make sure you or someone working with you has the means of contacting the emergency services. Carry a whistle. Always work with someone else within contact distance. A first aid kit including a large wound dressing, eye wash and eye dressing should be available in addition to the personal first aid kit carried by the operator. When two people are working together have a safe working zone of at least twice the timber length or 5 metres, whichever is greatest. Timber should be left in a safe, stable condition.

Gunton Wood.... Grass Cutting Mower / Strimmer / Brush Cutter

| Hazard | Risk | Level | Actions |
|---|-------------------------------------|--------|--|
| Use of strimmer, mower, brush cutter | Injury to operative and others | High | Adequate training essential. Correct PPE to be worn. First aid kit must be available. Never leave unattended. Stop if members of public approach working area. |
| Use of strimmer, mower, brush cutter | Flying debris | High | Check area and remove loose material before working. |
| Use of strimmer, mower, brush cutter | Striking hidden objects, cables etc | Medium | Visually check area for obstructions. Report cables to appropriate authority. |
| Fuelling machine | Fire, explosion | High | No smoking. Fuel to be kept in proper container. Use proper filling nozzle. Clean up spills. |
| Extended use of machine | Vibration | High | Machine to be properly maintained. Operative to be assessed for maximum trigger time and hand/body vibration, and exposure reduced as necessary with rest periods. |
| On-site maintenance | Injury to operative | Medium | Adequate training essential. Ensure engine is fully closed down and given time to cool. Place machine on firm, level surface. |

Gunton Wood.... Ditch or Pond Working

| Hazard | Risk | Level | Actions |
|---|--|--------|---|
| Fall, slip or trip on entering or exiting | Sprains, bruises, cuts, etc. | High | Wear sturdy boots or wellies with good tread. Enter/exit slowly with the help of a colleague. Broken skin must be washed and treated immediately. |
| Infection | Infection through water borne bacteria | Medium | Ensure any broken skin is covered with waterproof plaster. Avoid water contact with face. Wear waterproof gloves and footwear. Avoid touching face with gloves. |
| Injured or incapacitated | Unable to attract attention | Medium | Do not work alone when working in the ditch or pond. |

General. After working in the pond or ditch make sure your hands are washed thoroughly, preferably with anti-bacterial handwash, before eating or drinking.
