

Gunton Wood, Green Space and Foxburrow Tree Inspection 2015

Foxburrow

1. GWCP – remove remainder of logs from oak tree that has previously been taken down
2. WN – tidy up large branches on oak tree that is overhanging garden fence
3. GWCP/WN – keep an eye on ash tree near stream
4. WN – reduce height of dead sycamore to fork
5. WN – remove ash tree that is leaning into neighbouring ash

Green Space

1. Ash tree that was cut back last year may have die back – leave for now
2. GWCP – replace snapped-off silver birch, with small oak
3. GWCP – replace stake on silver birch, which is currently rubbing against the bark
4. WN – waiting for bat survey to be done before removing large ash trees
5. GWCP – tidy up small copse of sycamores, removing those marked

Gunton Wood

1. WN – remove 2 dead elms from wild wood alongside wild flower meadow
2. GWCP – remove tops of hawthorns in B&B area, with long-handled loppers
3. GWCP – remove dead elm in secret garden area
4. Large ash at top of Moore's lane can be left for now
5. GWCP – 2 dead elms near John & Mo's gate to be removed/reduced
6. GWCP – Wych elm on main path to be reduced in height
7. WN – remove rotting sycamore near main gate, at junction between main path and pond path
8. GWCP – remove overhanging branches from ash on path from main gate towards shed
9. GWCP – remove dead/leaning elms on main path towards PwH
10. WN – remove rotting sycamore on main path at junction with Moore's lane

Appendix
